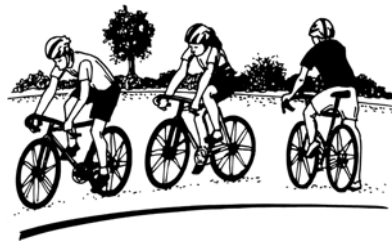

Don't you love listening to small children who provide their own soundtrack? As they play or draw or follow along as Mom shops, they sing quietly to themselves. I was shopping recently and heard a sweet little voice in the next aisle. She was singing and when she rounded the corner I could see that she had choreography to go along with her song. She was singing about God's love and how we can share it with others.

A beautiful reminder that it's Vacation Bible School season!

When I was growing up, VBS was all about lining up on the sidewalk to process into the sanctuary for Opening Assembly. There were Bible lessons, games, crafts (Remember those cigar boxes decorated with macaroni and gold paint?) and snacks. We learned to pray out loud at VBS, taking turns to pray within our small groups for our snacks and for our classmates. We learned our way around the Bible at VBS, as our teachers helped us find memory verses and we took turns reading aloud about Jesus and other Bible heroes.

If it has been a while since you volunteered at VBS or dropped off kids and grandkids, you would be impressed with the changes! Following in the creative footsteps of Sesame Street and other children's programming, VBS is big business for Christian publishers. Creative teams work year-round to develop Bible-based themes supported by original music, colorful graphics, interactive Bible lessons, theme-related crafts and snacks, and complete instructions for all the volunteers.

VBS today is Christian Education at its best.

This is significant in a culture where the majority of kids are un-churched. One week of this wonderfully innovative VBS can help plant the seeds of faith in children who are growing up without Sunday School, without prayers at mealtime, and without families actively engaged in a local faith community.

As Christians living in a secular culture, *we need to think and act like missionaries*. God calls us to tell the stories of Jesus to a new generation. VBS is an awesome way to do that! I hope you are thinking of children you have connections with in the neighborhood, on the soccer team, or at the dance studio. Imagine what might happen if each family at FCC committed to bring a carload of kids to VBS next week.

VBS registration continues all this week. Forms are available online or stop by the church office. Children in our community need to know that Jesus loves them. By bringing them to VBS you will help them discover the greatest story ever told. Isn't that why we're here?

### Disciples Summer Mission 2015

What an amazing experience it was being able to spend a week in Nashville with 311 other disciples from the Southwest Region to do mission work around the area. Twenty of us from Wichita Fall joined First Christian Midland on the road and made our way to Nashville with a pit stop in Little Rock, AR to rest. We were hosted by Vanderbilt University for our stay in Nashville and the accommodations were magnificent - from the dorms we stayed in to the food we ate.

The first two days we were assigned to be working at Safe Harbor, a halfway housing complex for non-violent offenders, mostly drug-related issues. There we worked painting rooms, pulling weeds, and just giving the place a brighter look. One thing that stuck with me from this location is that on the first day when our youth started painting their assigned room, one of the tenants immediately began working with us and painting along with the youth. This gentleman had only gotten out three days earlier and he was kind, he was helpful, he was generous, he just wanted to get back on track and stay there, just like we all do. God grants all of us grace, a second chance at love and many of the men we worked alongside only are wanting that same grace.

The third and final work day we decided to branch off with the Midland group and work at a different location. Safe Haven, a homeless shelter in Nashville gave us a wonderful opportunity! Together our two youth groups packed up a family of 8 living at this shelter, cleaned their room while some youth helped with childcare of the 6 children, and moved them into their very first home! What a moving experience it was to be able to give this family help and be witness to them receiving such an amazing place to call their own. Safe Haven's philosophy was not "fix" this family and then help them find a home, but rather to find them a home and work on the things that needed "fixed" once they were standing on their own two feet.

Tack all this in with a Nashville Sounds baseball game, line dancing at the Wild Horse Saloon, shopping at downtown Nashville, a BBQ at Centennial Park, and God's spirit, grace, and love around every corner and what a trip it was. I watched the youth work as the hands and feet of Jesus. I saw them grow and learn. I watched them work as a team and push each other to do their best work. I saw their eyes opened to the love and grace of God and the tough lives that others lead. I watched God work through the youth as they served others.

### AUGUST MSU GARAGE GIVEAWAY

As a member of the world outreach ministry, I have the honor of sharing and reminding our church family about a special Mission Project we have chosen for this fall, to coincide with our church's 125th Anniversary. Every year MSU brings in young college students from all over the world. Many of these come with only 2 suitcases and are placed in apartments with only a bed for furnishings. These students don't have the transportation to go get tables, chairs, desks and sofas even if they came with the funds to do so. We will be partnering with Heritage Assembly of God, who has been helping these students for several years, meet the needs of these students. We would like to ask for all of you to start thinking about what you have that you might be ready to pass on and clean out your kitchen utensils, pots/pans, knives, dishes as well as linens & blankets. They will be provided a Double bed, but larger sheets can still be used. Bathroom towels, any household items that you think someone setting up an apt. could use. I've seen these students sitting in their bathrooms, or on the kitchen counter after dark, as they didn't have overhead lights in these apt. bedrooms or living rooms to study by, so lamps are in much demand. We are making arrangements for storage this summer, so we will let you know where you can drop these things off soon. In the mean time, you have a great reason to "purge" and get organized and help with a mission in our own backyard. It's amazing how God shows us ways we can help people and show God's love right here at home. What if 125 church members helped 125 students in desperate need, in honor of our church anniversary. 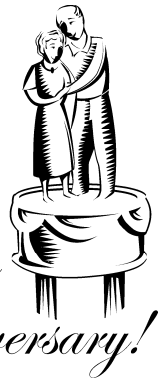

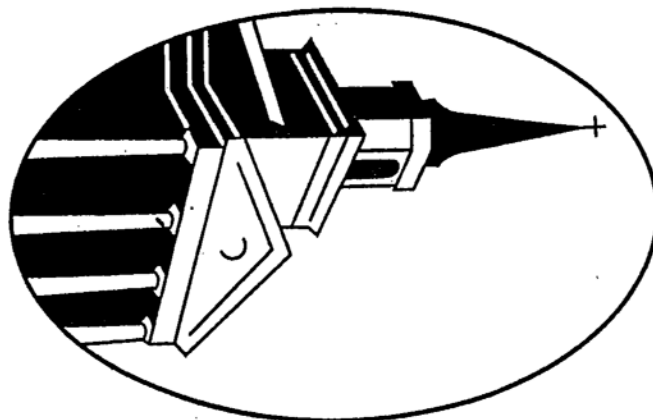
