

## SLOWING DOWN TO BE WITH GOD



Do you remember how you learned to pray?

As I was growing up, the family blessing before each meal was always the same:

*We thank you, dear Lord, for this food.*

*Bless it to our bodies and forgive us our sins.*

*In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.*

Then there was the prayer before bed. It was the usual "Now I lay me down to sleep" with a "God bless" list at the end for all my VIP's and particular petitions that changed daily. The bedtime ritual never varied. If I skipped my prayer, it was hard to fall asleep.

Fast forward a few years and I'm teaching my children. What sweet memories! Listening to their prayers helped me see the world from their point-of-view. I wish that I had kept of record of the things that Ben and Andy said when they prayed. A few nights after my Dad passed away, Andy prayed "And God, I sure hope Granddaddy's having a good time in heaven!"

We learn to pray in a simple way, we teach our children a simple form of prayer, and then somehow as adults we make prayer unbelievably complicated. Why is that? I guess we figure God expects something more grown up from us, that we need to demonstrate our progress by using important words and advanced theology. We are so intent on avoiding superficial prayer that we often convince ourselves not to pray at all. We'll wait until we have more time to devote to it. We want to get it right.

Can you imagine what would happen to the significant relationships in our lives if we adopted that communications plan? (If you're like me, you don't have to imagine. You have firsthand proof.)

Pastor and Christian teacher Bill Hybels tells the story of a prayer-less time in his adult life. He was discouraged. He prayed on Sunday morning as he led worship. He prayed with his wife and children before family meals. But that was it. Can you imagine a pastor who doesn't pray? It happens more often than you think.

Bill Hybels took on the project of writing his book *Too Busy Not To Pray: Slowing Down to Be with God* in order to pull himself out of his personal prayer drought. It is Prayer 101. He shares his own struggle with great honesty.

If your prayer life isn't what you want it to be, I invite you to join me for a midweek conversation about prayer.

We'll enjoy some of Bill Hybels' teaching about prayer. And we'll talk together about what's holding us back from an authentic, ongoing conversation with God. Study guides (optional) are available for \$8 in the church office.

Please come. I'm looking forward to our time together!

### MSU GARAGE GIVEAWAY COMPLETED

After weeks of work, the fruits of our efforts were distributed last weekend. We filled 70+ boxes of basic household items. Fifty-two of those were delivered to Heritage Church where they were given out to the new members of the Caribbean Students Organization. Five people from First Christian attended to we could see where our boxes were going. There was a very impressive group of young people who are entering the college with support from the upper classmen and alumni of the CSO.

Then on Sunday afternoon, a large number of church members with pickups assembled at Jerry's Sporting Goods to deliver the furniture and remaining boxes to the other international students (non-islanders). The athletic department at MSU sent the Men's Basketball Team, who were a great help with loading and delivery. Some of them scored lamps or tables, so the circle continued to widen. Deliveries were made to 29 apartments. They average 2-3 students per apartment, so with the 52 Caribbean, we blessed around 125 students! Folks who made deliveries returned with stories of very grateful recipients and of apartments that were truly bare before we got there.

We hope we will find other ways to assist these students. Renee Hoke found a couple of young ladies to mentor during the semester. We have some money left, so we can dedicate that to filling future needs as we hear of them. Someone suggested an occasional meal at the church or using the church van to take students to Walmart. We have been a blessing to many already and hope to continue to share with this community as the Holy Spirit leads us.

Thank you, thank you to all who donated so generously! Special thanks to Jerry Johnson and his staff for use of the space, t-shirts to volunteers, and many acts of kindness.


