





Welcome to the Neighborhood--A Midweek Ministry at FCC
New Worship Experience begins Sept. 7



Our Ministry Goals for the Neighborhood:

- To grow our ministry to young families and others by offering an alternate day and time for worship. (No longer will busy weekends keep you from worship!)
- To offer a different style of worship (acoustic, informal, techno friendly) that does not compete with Sunday morning traditional worship.
- To create community by sharing meals and worship in a single, relaxed setting.
- To be a welcoming worship alternative for MSU students.
- To develop a visible outdoor venue near that encourages people from the MSU campus and the neighborhood to gather, enjoy FCC hospitality, and get to know each other.

Neighborhood Schedule:

- 5:30-6:00 pm—Food available.

- 6:00 pm.—Worship begins in Fellowship Hall. Coffee and food still available.
- 7:00 pm—Worship concludes and participants move outside to enjoy food truck or food from grill, family games, conversation.
- Young Disciples class (K through 5th grade) 6:30-8:00 pm in Scout Hall/Activities Area and CYF/Chi Rho in Activities Area 7:00-8:00 pm.

Neighborhood Worship features:


- Small child play area in a corner of Fellowship Hall where parents can stay with little ones throughout worship.
- Communion served early in the service before children leave for Young Disciples.
- Interactive children's message.
- K-5th grade children leave worship at 6:30 pm for their own Young Disciples class.
- Chi Rho and CYF will participate and lead in all aspects of worship.
- A prayer wall where participants can leave their prayer requests

that will be shared with Elders and FCC Prayer Team.

- Technology used throughout worship.
- Instead of a sermon, the message is a two-way teaching conversation about faith, scripture and following Jesus in our world today. There will be a teaching emphasis throughout worship.

Forming a Midweek Community

It is our prayer that God will help us gather folks on Wednesday nights from a variety of backgrounds, age groups, and interests. It is possible that some who come to be part of the Neighborhood may worship somewhere else on Sunday mornings or not at all. We will have opportunities because of fellowship time before and after worship service to get to know our guests, hold extended conversations, take time to pray specifically for someone in need. We encourage members of our church family to join us on Wednesday evenings and help us extend warm FCC hospitality to our guests.

The Ministry of Hospitality

Ever since my first visit to the five Spanish missions of Old San Antonio, I have been fascinated by the tradition of monastic hospitality. Saint Benedict of Nursia (480-547 AD) expected that many different people would come to the monastery, so he made provisions for their comfort. In his Rule, he called for a porter to be stationed at the monastery's entrance to make sure that visitors would always be recognized and greeted. Benedict took special care that the poor be noticed as guests. "As soon as anyone knocks, or a poor man calls out, he [the porter] replies, 'Thanks be to God' or 'Your blessing, please'; then, with all the gentleness that comes from the fear of God, he provides a prompt answer with the warmth of love."

Besides the poor, Benedict was intent on welcoming travelers ("pilgrims") and wrote, "Great care and concern are to be shown in receiving poor people and pilgrims, because in them more particularly Christ is received." Hospitality in the Rule of St. Benedict is provided not only in the form of food ("the abbot's table must always be with guests and travelers") but lodging as well. Benedict, speaking of the guesthouse, instructs that "adequate bedding should be available there."

On the Friday afternoon of HHH weekend, First Christian Church opens its doors in a manner not so different from Benedict's monastery. Our pilgrims are bikers—108 of them this year—who seek lodging on the night before the big race. The journey was a long one for some of our guests. Some set out from Arkansas, others from Mexico. Some bikers this year were members of the Lubbock "Project Hero" Section of Ride 2 Recovery, a program for wounded veterans.

For nine years now, the porters at our monastery are members of the Discovery Class. If the class members are Benedictine porters, then Cindy Hernandez is our own St. Benedict. Cindy begins taking reservations months before the race. Some regular guests request a specific classroom. Cindy and her helpers arrive early on Friday to simmer spaghetti sauce, bake brownies, slice watermelon, and set out signs directing weary travelers to the registration table. When guests arrive they bring their expensive bicycles inside and park them near where they plan to sleep. Once mattresses are inflated and sleeping bags unfurled, hungry pilgrims make their way to Fellowship Hall for dinner. Meanwhile, a licensed masseuse sets up her table in the gym—offering a ten-minute massage for only \$10. Just before bedtime, the Chapel is open for a brief service of blessing and communion.

Lights out comes early because our cyclists rise long before dawn to dress in colorful jerseys and bike shorts and make one more trip to Fellowship Hall for a hearty breakfast. It is still dark when they set out for the starting line downtown.

The writer of Hebrews advises "Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained **angels** without knowing it." (Hebrews 13:2) May God continue to bless this ministry of hospitality, those who serve, those who stay, and all the angels among us!

Prime Timers Luncheon will be this Sunday, September 4th, at 12:00 noon in the Fellowship Hall.


Labor Day, September 5th: The Church Building, Offices & All Programs will be CLOSED.

As you know, the number of church members participating regularly in Sunday School has been declining steadily for years. Approximately, 40% of those currently attending worship (Chapel and Sanctuary) at First Christian Church participate in a Sunday School class. We want to increase that number. 


