LOVE ON FOUR WHEELS: A STORY FROM OUR 2017 CAR SHOW


Before I talked with Darrell Krebs earlier this month at our 8th annual Cruisin' for Christ Car Show, I don't believe I understood what it was like to be in love with an automobile. Now I do. Here's his story:

Back in 1980 during Darrell's high school days, he became the proud owner of a 1977 Pontiac Can-Am. He loved that car the way all teenagers love their first set of wheels. And he kept it from 1980-1989. But he didn't take good care of it. And eventually he traded it in for something else.

It was only later that Darrell discovered what a rare automobile he had been driving. Pontiac produced the Can-Am for one year only—a grand total of 1,377 Can-Ams rolled off the assembly line. As Darrell studied the history, he wished he had taken better care of his car. If only he had realized what he had! So he made up his mind to find a Can-Am that he could restore and enjoy.

Over the next 20 years, Darrell searched and researched and even made road trips to Tulsa and Houston when he located an owner interested in selling his Can-Am. But the cars he saw were in bad shape and needed far too much work, so his search continued. Finally, in 2015, Darrell contacted an owner in St. Charles. Missouri. Because of the distance, Darrell hired a third party inspector to take a look at the car which had undergone a "frame off" restoration. (That means every piece of the car was taken apart, restored, and reassembled. Think of it as vehicular resurrection.) In the course of these conversation, Darrell received the VIN number for the vehicle. And because he keeps everything, Darrell just happened to have his old insurance card. The beautifully restored 1977 Pontiac Can-Am was Darrell's long lost love-the car he had let slip through his fingers so long ago.

Now Darrell takes his car out only for car shows. Only 900 miles driven since the restoration. The rest of the time his prize Can-Am has a place of honor in his garage. "I guess you could say I keep it in a kind of shrine," Darrell says with a laugh. In his album, there's a photo circa 1980 of 18-year-old Darrell in his graduation cap and gown standing in his mom Virginia's driveway next to his Can-Am. In the next photo, taken 26 years later, there's the same car in the same driveway. And next to the car, a slightly older but wiser Darrell smiles for the camera.

New on the Library Shelves. . .

Disciples and the Bible by M. Eugene Boring

As a New Testament scholar, a seminary professor at Brite Divinity School, and an ordained Disciples minister, the author has undertaken the writing of this book because he was interested in how our denomination has interpreted the Bible. He is concerned with what we as a church (beginning with the Stone-Campbell movement) have gained in our dialogue with the Bible, what we have lost, how we got where we are, and where we go from here. He emphasizes that this book can only be a beginning point. Much remains to be explored.

<u>Barton Warren Stone – Early American Advocate of Christian</u> <u>Unity</u> by William Garrett West

Stone, along with Thomas and Alexander Campbell and Walter Scott, constituted what has been called the "big four" of the religious movement which resulted in two Protestant groups of today, the Disciples of Christ and Churches of Christ. Stone sowed the seed of Christian unity based on the love and spirit of Jesus Christ in a day when few favored unity.

This study reveals the significance of Barton Stone, not only for his time, but for ours. And not only for Disciples, but for all who are interested in the ecumenical movement.

Who Stole the American Dream? by Hedrick Smith

Pulitzer Prize winner Hedrick Smith has written an eyeopening account of how, over the past four decades, the American Dream has been dismantled and we became two Americas. At the end of this work Smith offers ideas for restoring America's great promise and restoring the American Dream.

God's Healing in Grief by Ron & Kathleen Duncan

Authors Ron and Kathleen Duncan live in Wichita Falls. This book will help people who are grieving to hear and process God's Word so that deep despair can give way to genuine hope. These lessons will help gently bring you to a place of true comfort found only in God and his Word.

If Life Is A Game, These Are The Rules by Cherie Carter Scott

Cherie, a corporate trainer and consultant, composed a list of basic truths about life which resonated with her clients and was shared many places, including "Chicken Soup for the Soul." Now she has elaborated on these truths, stressing lessons that can be learned from each rule and offering insights on self-esteem, respect, acceptance, gratitude, and courage.

In this wonderful little book, Cherie advises the reader to look at each of life's happenings and ask, "What is there for me to learn from this experience?"

<u>Saint Saul</u> A Skeleton Key to the Historical Jesus by Donald Harman Akenson

In this book, Akenson offers a lively and provocative account of what we can learn about Jesus by reading the letters of Paul, giving the reader new insights into both Jesus and Paul. He does this by recreating the world of Christ and stressing the Jewishness of Jesus. Though Paul did not know Jesus personally, he knew most of his important followers, and his teachings were approved by Jesus' brothers and other early leaders.

The author feels that the traditional source of facts about Jesus are generally traced through parallels among the 4 gospels, which were handed down as a unit by later generations. He feels that Paul's letters (written before 70 CE) are the only direct evidence we have that is untainted by the shift in perspective in the Christian and Jewish faiths caused by the destruction of the $2^{\rm nd}$ Temple in 70 CE.

Akenson is an eminent historian and has approached the subject with a fresh eye and scholarly rigor that can be rare in this hotly contested field. The book will captivate anyone seeking to know more about the historical Jesus and the earliest Christians.
