A MINISTRY STRATEGY FOR THIS TIME IN-BETWEEN

It's time to check in on a conversation that began with the FCC Board a year ago. As we made plans for Dave Hartman's retirement, our leaders agreed to focus all of our energy during the interim period on rebuilding our ministry to children and youth.

Here's a progress report:

- After a lengthy search, we added Josh and Claire to the staff last fall, making full-time staff commitments to children and youth.
- Our fall stewardship campaign emphasized our 2017-2018 strategy for growing ministry to children and youth.
- On Laity Sunday in January, FCC children and youth under the direction of Josh and Claire led us in worship. At the luncheon that followed, children and youth recruited ministry volunteers for the year ahead.
- Special activities for children and youth during Spring Break week encouraged members to bring a friend. Thirteen youth attended the Spring Break Lock-in. Thirteen children attended two on-site activities.

I think we all agree that Josh and Claire are making a HUGE difference to the vitality of First Christian Church, but they can't do it alone. It takes a whole congregation to grow ministry to children and youth. That's because a personal invitation from a church member remains the most effective way to grow any ministry. Will you share what's happening at FCC with families in your neighborhood? Will you provide transportation to kids on your block? Will you take some time at church events to get to know

the young people who are here already? Will you pray for our success in planting the seeds of faith in more young lives?

As we pray for the members of our Search Committee working diligently to find the next Senior Minister, we will continue to devote our time, our talents and our resources to rebuilding ministry to children and youth. This is our ministry strategy for the in-between time!

Excerpt from 2017 stewardship letter: *Our faithful financial stewardship is another way we demonstrate our commitment to follow Jesus through our actions toward others. Our budget for 2018 will include salaries and new program support for two wonderful additions to the FCC Pastoral Team. Josh deSteiguer and Claire Baer are truly an answer to our prayers. These talented young adults have a passion for planting the seeds of faith in young lives. A year ago as our search committees drafted job descriptions for these two full-time positions, we cast a vision for ministry to children and youth in Wichita Falls as well as to members of our church family. Next year, through your generous support, the ministry of First Christian Church will reach well beyond the walls of our building into neighborhoods where the good news of Jesus Christ will change young lives and strengthen families.*

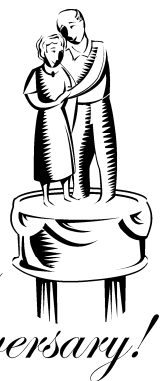

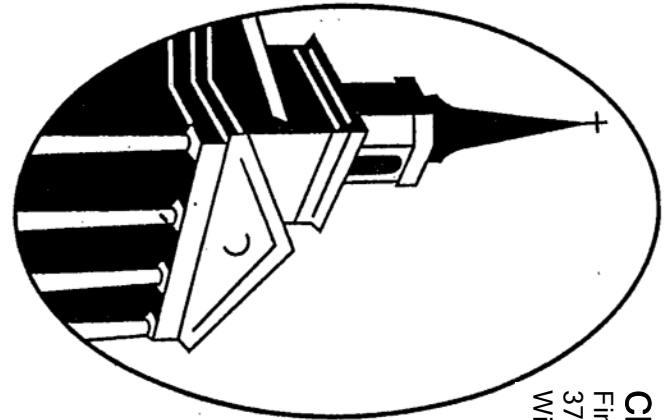
