EXECUTIVE COUNCIL VOTES TO CONTINUE COMMON GROUND RECOVERY MINISTRY



Over the past several weeks, our Outreach Ministry, Stewardship Ministry and Executive Council have received reports on the life-changing ministry underway at FCC every Tuesday evening. Common Ground Recovery Ministry is in transition once again after Catholic Charities announced they would end their 18-month partnership with FCC effective May 31. On Tuesday evening the Executive Council approved an interim ministry plan and budget, with Rev. Margaret Scales stepping up to serve part-time as Interim Director of CGRM.

Here are excerpts from testimonies by CGRM leaders and clients about the merits of the program:

"My name is Elizabeth Ivey, LPC, and I have had the honor of teaching the Parenting Skills Training Group with Common Ground Ministry for the last year. There is a tremendous need for this program in our community. I've dealt with families from all over the area who do not have the resources to drive to Dallas/Fort Worth for similar classes. While I have been teaching this class, I have seen amazing results. Most parents come in very guarded, convinced I am going to condemn them for their past parental failings; however, after (on average) 4 sessions, their whole demeanor changes to one of total engagement, asking questions and sharing personal experiences. On several occasions I have clients walk up to me after class to let me know they have learned something or tell me about how the relationship with their children is already starting to get better and how they feel more confident in their parenting."

"My name is Stacey. I am a survivor of 3 abusive marriages and sex trafficking. I went to First Step 3 times before I was finally ready for its services. Then I began counseling and my counselor referred me to Common Ground. I started attending the class "Rebuilding After the Relationship Ends." That class helped the healing process and I began to apply it to everything I did. The difference it made was remarkable. Life-changing. I began to heal in every way and learned to become more assertive. I was able to look at who I really was and not who I was told I was. After I completed the Rebuilding Class I went into the more in-depth Parenting Class so that I could learn the skills to best help my children because of what they had been through. My prayer for them is to heal, be safe, loved, and protected. I can't express enough just how important Common Ground is to people like me and just how much this program has helped me become the woman of God that I had always been created to be. Thank you from the bottom of my heart."

Susan has been involved with Kiwanis for ten years and it is obviously a cause and organization that is near and dear to her. During the first few meetings I attended I was thrilled to learn about the wonderful things Kiwanis does in the here in Wichita Falls and worldwide. The mainstay of Kiwanis is empowering young people to be leaders in the community. They have active clubs at Hirschi, Rider, and Old High, MSU, and several of the Junior high schools in the area as well. When I learned that it was a service organization that specialized in working with youth I knew it was a perfect fit for me. Kiwanis was exactly what I was looking for, an opportunity to build pastoral relationships with youth who are outside of our congregation. They also happen to meet at Luby's for lunch each Wednesday and I'm a sucker for buffets. I attend the meetings for Hirschi High School each week and have been blessed to build relationships with this group of young leaders. I love the fact that I get work with a group of fourteen youth who I otherwise would never have had a chance to minister to.

Since becoming a member of Kiwanis, I have been fortunate enough to take part in several of their service projects and fundraisers. Each Christmas the University Kiwanis Club donates sweaters to each student in four local elementary schools. This past year I got to act as "Santa's elf" at Zundy Elementary and hand out tons of sweaters, candy canes, and smiles. I was also trained in the art of the griddle while being a pancake cook for our annual pancake feast fundraiser which provides the funding for all of the service projects throughout the year. By the way, I had never flipped a pancake in my life before that day. Right now with baseball season in full swing, the University Kiwanis Club is busy running the concession stand at Kiwanis Park. This has given me another fun opportunity to work side by side with youth, building relationships and doing community work together. I have had a great time this spring making snow-

cones, nachos, popcorn, and much more with the youth from Hirschi on several occasions and even got to work with our own Ainslee Buckley on one night when Old High's Club was covering concessions.

I have immensely enjoyed getting to be a part of a great organization like Kiwanis; and I am thrilled to be a part of a church that places so much value on service to the community beyond our walls. I look forward to seeing this partnership continue to bear fruit for Kiwanis, and FCC in the future.

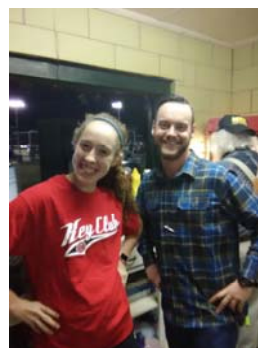

Heifer still gives animals along with required training and sharing of the gift. As a result, now millions of animals and their offspring have made life more stable for families and communities. Families have more to eat, extra to sell, and growing knowledge of good farming practices. Watch for forms with which to give a gift of bees, rabbits, goats, cows, and other animals.

Strong-willed and charismatic, Lester Rozell was school superintendent in the small East Texas town of Oakwood from the 1930's to the 1960's. Into That Good Night, is a heartbreaking memoir of a son's memory of his life a long time ago.

Announcing Our New Church Directory

Work on a new pictorial church directory is underway now. It is a directory that is accessible through your smart phone, easily updated, and allows you to manage your photo with an easy upload process. For our members who prefer a paper copy of the directory, they will be available soon.

Here are the simple steps to follow using your smart phone:

- Visit the Google Play or Apple App store to download the "RDS Unite" app onto your phone.
- Once the download is complete, open the app and add the First Christian Church code **14351** in the space provided for the organizational church code.
- Now tap "register here" and enter your email address. It is important that you use the email address on file in the church office. If you encounter problems on this step, call the church office so we can confirm the email address we have on file.
- Now set your password. Then tap register. A confirmation email will be sent to you immediately. Follow the instructions in the email and you're all set.
- When you open the directory next, tap on the square menu icon found middle right just under the church name. Next tap "My Family" and then tap "Family Photo." There are several ways to select photos depending on the device you use.

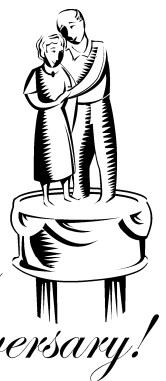

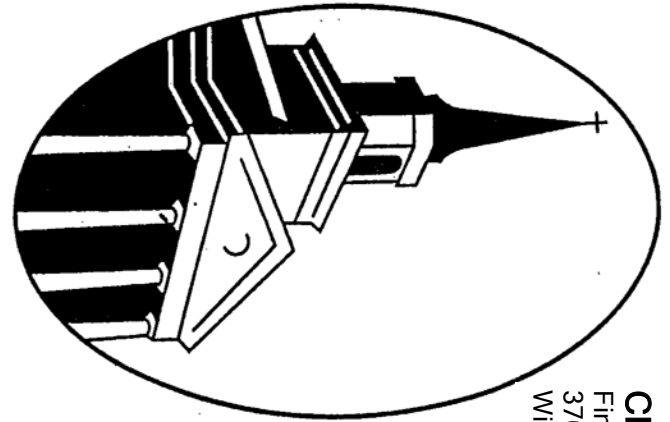
