## Fall Bible Study

The Prodigal God by Timothy Keller

In *The Prodigal God*, Timothy Keller uses one of the best-known Christian parables to reveal an unexpected message of hope and salvation. Taking his trademark intellectual approach to understanding Christianity, Keller uncovers the essential message of Jesus, locked inside his most familiar parable. Within that parable, Jesus reveals God's prodigal grace toward both the irreligious and the moralistic. This book will challenge both the devout and skeptics to see Christianity in a whole new way.

Timothy Keller, a *New York Times* bestselling author, is the founding pastor of Redeemer Presbyterian Church in Manhattan, which he started in 1989 with his wife, Kathy, and three young sons. For 28 years he led a diverse congregation of young professionals that grew to a weekly attendance of over 5,000. Dr. Keller was born and raised in Pennsylvania and educated at Bucknell University, Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary, and Westminster Theological Seminary.

# Children's Ministry News!

The beginning of a new school year can be stressful and anxiety inducing. There are so many expectations placed on young people and the pressure of it all can sometimes be too much to handle. As a parent, it can be so

easy to minimize your child's anxiety or to try and fix the problem without allowing the child to work through it on their own. One of my favorite tools I have on my bookshelf is "Faithful Families: Creating Sacred Moments At Home", written by Traci Smith. This book is full of rituals and activities that can be done at home as a family to enrich your spiritual lives. One of my favorite "ceremonies" that she includes is called "Wash Away Worry." For this ceremony all you need is some chalk, water, and a sidewalk or chalk board. If your child is anxious about something, have them write it down or draw it with the chalk. They can discuss this anxiety with you or they can simply keep it to themselves. This is a spiritual practice between them and God. It is important that you as the adult participate in the activity too. Explain that we all have worries and anxiety and they are all valid. Whether we choose to share our worries with others or keep them to ourselves, we can have peace knowing that God knows what is on our hearts and we can give it to God. Once

your worries are written you simply wash them away. Close with a prayer asking God to take those worries and work in your lives for your good and for God's glory.

I hope that you can use this ceremony, or your own version of it, to help bring God's love and peace into our sometimes overwhelming lives.


