Abide in Me

Last week, I traveled to Des Moines, Iowa, to represent First Christian Church at General Assembly. Every two years the Christian Church (*Disciples of Christ*) in the United States and Canada gathers for a General Assembly. All ordained and commissioned ministers in the church are eligible to attend as voting delegates and every congregation is apportioned a set number of voting delegates based on the number of its members.

Every General Assembly experience is an interesting mixture of church board meeting, Sunday School class, worship service, fellowship dinner, family reunion, and country fair. That description fit this year as well. To that end, let me share with you a few highlights from Des Moines:

1. On Saturday, Former General Minister and President Dick Hamm introduced a celebration of the 2020 Vision. Back in 1999, he called the church to plant 1,000 new churches, to revitalize 1,000 existing churches, to intentionally develop leaders for service in the church, and to further our desire to be a pro-reconciliation, anti-racism church. Since that call, Disciples have started more than 1,000 new churches (with a survival rate over 60%). Likewise, over 1,000 existing churches have been through intentional processes to adapt their ministries and many congregations now reflect the diversity of their communities. While there is still ongoing work to be done in developing leaders for the church, positive strides have been made here over the last 20 years.
2. Through the Assembly, there was an ongoing celebration of 50th Anniversary of the *Design*. Instead of being organized with a Constitution and Bylaws, the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) is governed by an intentional “design” - a document that states that to be the body we want to be, we need representation from every congregation, region, and organization. The work of “Restructure” during the latter half of the 1960s culminated in the 1968 Merger Agreement between the National Christian Missionary Society and the International Convention of Christian Churches (Disciples of Christ). The Disciples of Christ Historical Society provided a video featuring interviews with key leaders during that time and after sessions were held throughout the week with other Disciples personalities and leaders from the last 50 years.
3. Each General Assembly features Business Sessions. These sessions, similar to church Board Meetings, include reports from various ministries, celebrations, challenges, and resolutions for consideration. These resolutions do not speak *for* the church; they speak *to* the church. No resolution adopted at a General Assembly is binding on any local church or Region. This year, the business began with an acknowledgment that dissent has been missing from recent assemblies. There was a collective desire to make sure that all

viewpoints find their voices welcomed during business and throughout the Assembly. And that proved to be the case in Des Moines. On Saturday, the Assembly adopted a resolution submitted by the General Youth Council to take on a Spirit of Active Listening. This spirit characterized the remainder of business throughout the week as the church received reports, considered ministries to refugees and other marginalized groups, acknowledged covenantal affiliations, and agreed to be in full communion with the United Church of Canada.

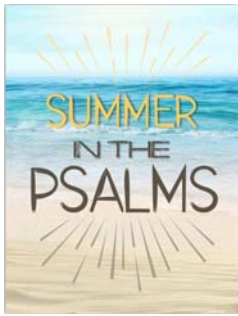
4. The Pension Fund Breakfast Monday morning gathered hundreds of participants to celebrate this vital ministry and to hear about how the Pension Fund became involved in hurricane relief in Puerto Rico by assisting Disciples pastors there.
5. Mission Fest - a section of the Exhibit Hall was set aside to hear presentations about various ministries carried out by Disciples churches around the country. It was interesting to hear about the work our sisters and brothers are conducting to reach people for Jesus Christ.
6. The music - especially the Assembly Choir, which featured Brian Nixon, Leo Davis, and Carolyn Hinton-Wright, was fabulous. So was the Children’s Choir which sang Monday evening.
7. The preaching - General Minister and President Rev. Terri Hord Owens, Rev. Dr. Nancy Gowler, Rev. Ruben del Pilar, Rev. Dr. Cynthia Hale, Rev. Mark Briley, and Rev. Dr. William J. Barber II.
8. The New Church Ministry challenged the church to consider a goal of one million new disciples/Disciples. First Christian Church in Wichita Falls will be a part of this goal in coming days.
9. The Remembrance of the Saints - at every Assembly, those who rest from their labors during the past two years are remembered. As the names scrolled across the screen this year, that list included numerous friends and colleagues throughout my ministerial career, including my friend and mentor, the Rev. Dr. Ron Sumter. Ron was a good and faithful servant of the church and an incredible guide for me. He officiated at my wedding and remained a good friend even after retiring.
10. The positive, up-beat, cooperative spirit of this gathering. There is much to celebrate across the breadth of our church, and I’m grateful for the covenant *which binds us to God and to one another*. [from the *Preamble to the Design for the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ)*]

I have been going to General Assemblies now for more than 20 years. Every one is unique, but I walk away from each with hope and with an eagerness to be about the work of our church.

The 2021 General Assembly will be in Louisville, Kentucky, on July 31 - August 4, 2021. Start making plans now to attend this assembly in the heart of where it all started for us as Disciples.

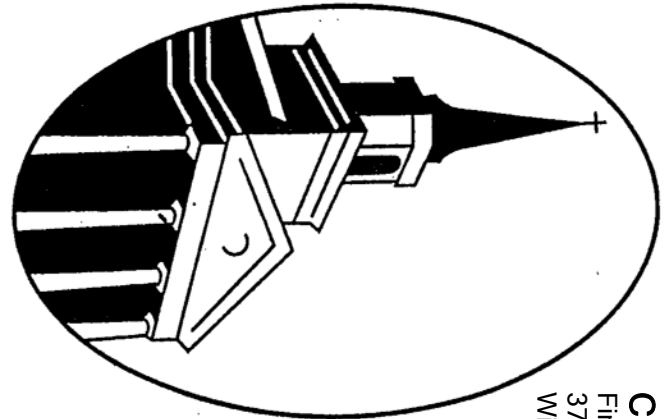
