## Thinking Long

Between the August Adult Forum on the *Generations in the Church* and the recent sermon on our value of being *Generational in our Leadership*, I've been thinking a lot about generations recently. I suspect that I have heightened sensitivity to passing on wisdom from one generation to another because of the situation I find myself in. As you know, my daughter, Abby, is a senior in high school. As such, I'm finding myself in "teaching" mode a lot, making sure that she is (more) equipped with the skills she will need to be out on her own this time next year.

One of the things I have been harping on recently is the need to set priorities. Her success as a college student will depend on her ability to give proper attention to her academics. What I remind Abby is that there will be plenty of things competing for her time. She will need to concentrate on the big picture - what she is trying to accomplish. By doing that, she will, hopefully, recognize when a short-term opportunity can have long-term consequences. Things like:

- waiting until the last minute to study resulting in long-term effects on her grade;
- sacrificing sleep in the short term eventually resulting in poor health in the long-run;
- giving in to the vendors pushing a discount for taking out their credit card resulting in increased risk and debt.

These are just a few of the pearls of wisdom I'm trying to share with her during her last year at home. I probably won't say everything she needs to know, and she probably won't remember everything she needs to know. But, that's how life works. Sometimes we just have to learn from our own experiences. Yet, my hope is that she will keep her eye on what she wants to do long-term, and use that to help her make choices in the near-term.

The same practical wisdom is true for the church. We need to keep an eye on where we are going and what we are called to do in the long-term. This is what will keep us from "tilting at windmills" in the short-term, choosing to do things that, while potentially meaningful, are sideways expenditures of energy, time, and other resources. Thinking long helps guide us in the short term, saying "yes" to the right things, and "no" to the wrong things.

Every year, Amazon shareholders receive a letter from founder, Jeff Bezos, in their annual report. Each year, he reminds these shareholders of their commitment to think long-term. In 2015, his letter opened with:

"A dreamy business offering has at least four characteristics. Customers love it, it can grow to very large size, it has strong returns on capital and it's durable in time - *with the potential to endure for decades.*" (emphasis added)

Every year, Bezos includes his original letter from Amazon's first annual report in 1997. That letter outlines nine ways Amazon will demonstrate their long-term approach, including the statement: "We will continue to make investment decisions in light of long-term market leadership

considerations rather than short-term profitability considerations or short-term Wall Street reactions."

The point of sharing this isn't to extol the virtues of a particular Fortune 500 company. The point is that long-term thinking can make a huge difference - in college and careers, but also in our spiritual lives and in the life of our church.

# LONG

The truth is, God has always been about the long term. God's big story of redemptive history begins with Adam and Eve outside the Garden of Eden and continues until the picture of Revelation 21 and 22 become reality. In between those pictures are thousands of years and hundreds of generations. As Auxano founder Will Mancini once wrote: "God chose to reveal God's self through

redemptive history. Time is God's canvas." (*God Dreams*, B&H Publishing, 2016)

We see this play out in scripture. Throughout the Old Testament, consequences are linked to generations. In Exodus 34:6-7, God reminds Moses that sin can affect "the third and the fourth generation." In the genealogy of Matthew Chapter 1, we see the long arc of God's story: "All the generations from Abraham to David were fourteen generations, and from David to the deportation to Babylon fourteen generations, and from the deportation to Babylon to the Christ fourteen generations." And 1 Chronicles 16:15 note that God will "remember his covenant forever, the word that he commanded, for a thousand generations."

So consider these reasons from *God Dreams* to think long, particularly as it affects your spiritual life (and personal ministry) and the ministry of First Christian Church. Think long...

Biblical reasons:

1. To love people beyond your lifetime.
2. Because that's how God reveals God's self.
3. Because, most likely, you will lead for a long time.
4. Because God thinks generationally.
5. Because you will live forever (eternal life with God).

Practical reasons:

6. Because how big you think guides how much you accomplish.
7. To build a ministry that will endure.
8. Because it costs you nothing.

Motivational reasons:

9. To master-plan your disciple-making impact.
10. To connect people to God's big story of redemption.
11. To focus a broader resource base.
12. So that God can do more than you think.

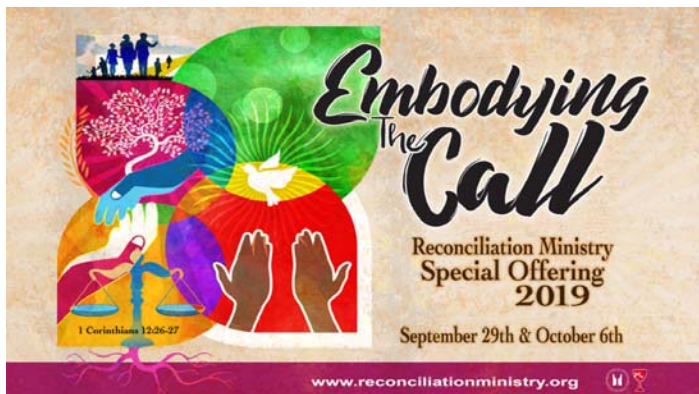
Reason #12 finds its root in my favorite benediction from Ephesians 3:20-21:

*Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen.*

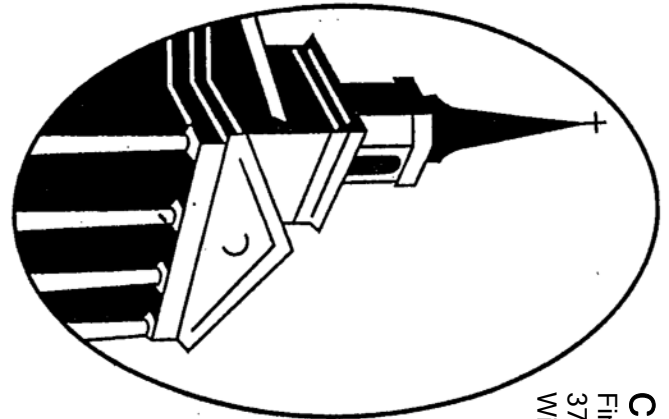
