Both/And

I recently overheard some things at church. A few weeks ago, I heard:

The fact is, when we confessed Jesus Christ as the Lord and Savior of our lives, we said we were turning over the management of our lives to Jesus Christ because he is our Lord. And Jesus isn't just the Lord of the big and lofty things in our lives. Jesus is the Lord of all of our lives. When we are inseparably connected to Jesus, every aspect of our life is connected to him as well.

Then, two weeks ago, I heard:

Today, being hospitable is about putting the priorities of those who are far from Christ ahead of our own and welcoming them without complaint. Let's not kid ourselves... that's, perhaps, the greatest challenge of hospitality. It's meeting the needs of people who don't necessarily look like us or have the same needs as us with a consistent, strenuous love. This kind of love is challenging. It's costly. It's time-consuming. Yet, it's also what Jesus did.

I also heard someone say:

The question is not what do I get by giving; the question is what do I become by giving?

And then just this week, I heard:

Our giving [is] in response to the surpassing grace of God's indescribable gift - the salvation we have in Jesus Christ. God's grace is the action; our giving is the response.

I have to confess...Josh and I were the ones who said these things. These were quotes from the sermons of our recent *Out of the Box* worship series. Of course, it is really easy to apply all of these quotes to the giving of our financial resources. But, what if the challenges of these quotes were applied to the way we serve - that we give of our time?

First Christian Church has a long history of service to our community. This service includes our commitment to Interfaith Outreach, our Coats for Kids program, partnering with the children of Fain Elementary (and other schools), supporting poverty eradication through Heifer International, and providing supplies for students though Project Back-to-School. More recently, this service to our community has also included Thanksgiving baskets, Mustang Meals, meeting the needs of arriving international students at MSU, supporting the Mustang pantry, and more. On top of this, I am really excited that we will be holding a Rise Against Hunger meal packing event on January 11. In two hours on this Saturday morning, we will pack more than 10.000 meals for distribution overseas. What I like best about this event are the opportunities for all ages to serve. There are jobs for children as young as three years old as well as jobs for those who need to sit the whole time. It truly is a way for the whole family to serve together.

This service to our community is biblical. Jesus said that the greatest commandments were to *love God with heart, soul, and mind, and to love your neighbor as yourself* (Matthew 22:34-40). Likewise, Paul said we are to *serve one another in love*

(Galatians 5:13). The expressions of community service listed above are done directly in response to these (and other) biblical mandates to be servants to all our sisters and brothers. And, as I mentioned in my last *Make Your Mark* column, these expressions of being outward-focused are a sign of a church being focused on mission and not maintenance - on being

focused on others and not just self. This is a good thing!

But, if we aren't careful, our zeal for service can get unbalanced. In an effort to serve others outside the church, we can overlook our



calling to serve others *in* the church. We can miss out on the joy that comes from serving within the church - to serving those who are first-time guests; those who need to be formed spiritually; those who are in need of care and compassion in authentic community.

We are entering a season in which we will be "turning up the heat" on serving in the church. For some, this call to serve in the church will come through our Nominating Committee as they prayerfully call members to serve in "set-apart" ministries like the Elders and Diaconate. For others, this call to serve the church will come through a call to raise our commitment to children, youth and their families. For just as we feed the hungry in our community, we need to be equally committed to feeding our children and youth (and their families) the word of God.

Australian pastor John Dickson once told the story of a church member named Kathy. When Kathy was six years old, her mother became ill with cervical cancer. The burden on their family was quite immense. Yet a knock on the door changed everything. Although they had never been involved with a local church, somehow the local Baptist congregation had learned of their situation and wanted to help. The congregation helped provide for the operation that enabled Kathy's mom to live for many years after. As a result, the family attended that church and held fond memories of their time there.

However, as the years rolled on, the family drifted away. For nearly 30 years, Kathy wasn't a part of a church community...that is, until her children started asking questions about Christianity. With such beautiful memories of a Christian community, Kathy did not hesitate to find a congregation and to start attending with her family. Suddenly, her dormant faith was reignited. And Kathy would say that the crucial factor in her journey to full faith was the kindness of that Baptist church. "How that congregation treated my family convinced me that there was a God and that he loves me." (*The Best Kept Secret of Christian Mission*, Zondervan, 2010).

Why do we serve? We do so because we might be the one that convinces another that there is a God who loves them. We do so because we may be the spark that reignites someone's faith. We do so because when we are inseparably connected to Jesus, every aspect of our lives is connected to him. We do so because it is our response to what God has done for us in Jesus Christ. We do so, not because of what we get from giving, but, because of what we become by giving. We do so because it's what Jesus did.

Our call to serving others in mission is both/and: it is both serving in the church and serving outside the church. Both are necessary. Both are required. Both are opportunities to joyfully transform another's life.

Prime Timers Luncheon will be on Sunday, December 1st, at 12:00 noon in the Fellowship Hall.


