For families who struggle financially, providing diapers for their young children is a huge challenge leading to a cycle of difficulty.

* Diapers cost up to \$100-150 per month, per baby.

* Many parents have to choose between buying food or diapers.

* Food Stamps cannot be used for diapers.

* Babies without disposable diapers are turned away from childcare.

* Parents without access to childcare can't go to work.

FCC's Outreach Partner, Interfaith Outreach, supplies each child with a large supply (80-100 depending on size) every 30 days through our Diaper Chest. Sizes 3 - 6 are preferred.

The Discipline of Lent

One of the resources I turn to regularly is the *Handbook of the Christian Year*. This sourcebook of historical references and worship materials notes the following:

At the heart of the Christian faith is our participation in the life, suffering, death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ as Lord. We proclaim that "the Word became flesh and dwelt among us" (John 1:14)...At the very center of our worship and proclamation is the story of God's whole history with humankind, brought to focus in the passion, death, and resurrection of Christ. Since the beginning of Christian worship, these events have given shape and meaning to the week, the whole year, and even to each day of the Christian community's life. In remembering the mystery of our redemption in Christ through the seasons of Lent and Easter, we are formed in the pattern of his death and resurrection and his life-giving Spirit.

Today is Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday developed as a day of penitence to mark the beginning of Lent - forty days of preparation for the celebration of Easter. It is designed to be a time for new beginnings in the faith and a time for returning to the Lord. Specifically, Ash Wednesday is a time to recall our mortality and to wait upon the Lord for a renewing Spirit. It is a time for putting aside our sins and failures of the past in light of who we are yet to become by the grace of God. As liturgist Hoyt Hickman puts it, "We are to be tested by the Spirit so that our participation in the meaning of the Easter faith may be authentic and a true dying and rising with Christ to new life in God."

Last week as I was walking across the TCU campus between two events at Ministers Week, I overheard a conversation between two young ministers. One was talking about his plans for Ash Wednesday and the innovations he was introducing this year. He described how his congregation was going to create their own ashes in the midst of the service. On little slips of paper, they were going to write all of the things they wanted to do better. Then, each individual would place these papers in a small container in front of them and light them on fire. The resulting ashes would then be used to "mark" them for Ash Wednesday.

I cringed as I heard him describe this plan. In my opinion, they were missing the notion of what the ashes

symbolize. Ash Wednesday is not about marking ourselves with a pledge to do better. Ash Wednesday is about recognizing we cannot do it ourselves. The ashes smudged on our foreheads are a reminder that "from dust we have come and to dust we shall return." We are mortal and we will die one day. No amount of self-improvement is going to save us from that reality. We need a Savior.

Melissa Musick Nussbaum recently wrote about the deep wisdom that comes from being marked by ashes:

In "The Rite of Penance, Volume 3," theologian Nathan Mitchell writes of the cross and the way Christians speak of having their sins absolved by it. He argues -- and this, I think, is far more difficult for us to accept -- that the cross is also where our illusions of righteousness are wiped away:

"God's act of reconciliation in Christ ... liberates people not only from failure and guilt but also from the suffocating goodness and virtue through which we attempt to earn salvation."

Nussbaum noted that it has taken her many years to recognize that the ashes placed on her head are "about the bone-deep reality behind the skin-deep veneer." We are marked with what we are. Yet, we are also marked with a cross. And, it is that cross where, as Nussbaum properly notes, "all that we clutch in our closed fists is carried away on a tide of mercy beyond imagining, beyond possibility, beyond our feeble ability to hope."

Ash Wednesday is not about new worship innovations, glitter ashes, or self-help. Ash Wednesday is about recognizing our own mortality. It is about calling us back to the notion that we need a savior, and to beginning an intensive journey of remembering God's redemptive acts in Jesus Christ, our Savior. What the next 40 days hold for us are opportunities to grow through repentance, fellowship, prayer, fasting, and concentration - to grow ever more receptive to the grace of God made known to us in Jesus Christ.

So as we being this journey, let me offer this word of advice. While Lent is one of the most intensive seasons of the church year, it requires a much different pace. The point of Lent is not to sprint through a series of events, classes, services, and busy work only to collapse the day after Easter. Rather, the discipline of Lent should sustain and refresh us so that we may give full expression to church life beyond Easter. I invite you, then, to slow down and give concentrated time to reflecting on God's mercy and love. I invite you to pray and to engage with God's word. I invite you to be in worship and fellowship with one another. I invite you, therefore, to the observance of a holy Lent.

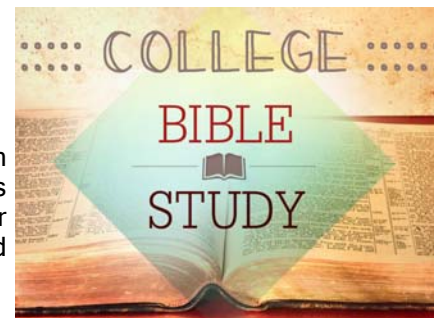

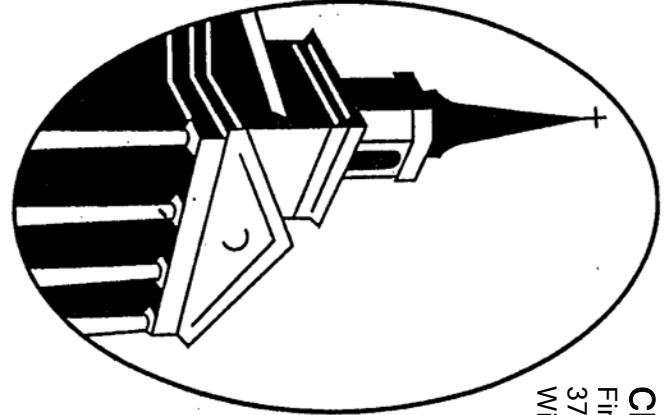
