## Babies Need Diapers!

### Pantry Sunday — October 11<sup>th</sup>

For families who struggle financially, providing diapers for their young children is a huge challenge leading to a cycle of difficulty.

\* Diapers cost up to \$100-150 per month, per baby.

\* Many parents have to choose between buying food or diapers.

\* Food Stamps cannot be used for diapers.

\* Babies without disposable diapers are turned away from childcare.

\* Parents without access to childcare can't go to work.

FCC's Outreach Partner, Interfaith Outreach, supplies each child with a large supply (80-100 depending on size) every 30 days through our Diaper Chest. Sizes 3 - 6 are preferred.

Help fill the shelves at Interfaith Outreach on **Sunday, October 11<sup>th</sup>**.

Bring packages of diapers, or monetary donations to serve these babies in need!

## Trip Planning (Part 2)

If you have ever been on a road trip, you know that the best way to get to your destination is to have a plan. If you just start driving without a destination in mind, there's a good possibility you won't ever get there. And if you have a destination in mind but don't spend time figuring out how to get there, you will likely waste a lot of time and gas by going the wrong way or taking a less efficient route. This same principle comes into play as we think about where we are headed as a church.

In my last *Make Your Mark* column, I painted a mental picture of what First Christian Church could look like by the year 2025. This picture comes from the work of our Vision Team - a picture which culminated in a description of where we believe God wants us to be five years from now. We stated it like this: *By 2025, we want to go from the One Table to 5000 tables.* Our Vision Team believes that five years from now, we will stand on the top of a vista where we will see with clarity that we filled 3500 empty tables, 1000 neighborhood tables, 300 family tables, and, 200 leadership tables.

To put this in trip planning language, this is the travel brochure. It is the picture - the vision - of what things will look like when we arrive at our final destination.

The travel brochure is nice - it's what makes us want to go to our destination. But, the travel brochure isn't very helpful for telling us how to get there. That's where a road map comes into play. The road map helps us plan a route that is both efficient and scenic.

As a church, the path to our destination is determined by our mission: *Shepherding every person to encounter the abundant peace of Christ.* This mission serves as our compass and guiding North Star. Before we can even use the map, we need to know which way is North. Otherwise, we will think we are on the right path, only to discover that we started in the wrong direction. Our mission provides the proper direction and points everyone in that direction.

As the Vision Team began their work on our "road map" towards our 2025 Vision, we noted that there were several "stops" we needed to make along the way. These "stops" (or, better said, big items to be realized) included:

- Engagement with MSU students
- Enhancing our brand
- Optimizing our facilities
- Developing leaders

These four things are the four big "hows" to get to our one big "what." To achieve our vision of *going from the One Table to 5000 tables by 2025*, we will have to figure out how to meet the needs of the students across the street at Midwestern State University. We will have to build and leverage our "brand" (which is more than just a logo - it's what we will be known for in the community). We will have to make some exciting, strategic, and,

perhaps, expensive decisions about how we best configure our facilities for the future. And, it goes without saying, that none of this will be possible if we don't develop leaders to help pilot the church into that future.

As I suggested last time, the first leg of this journey is family ministry. As the Vision Team drew their work to a close, there was complete agreement that our first "next step" needed to be a church wide emphasis on our ministries to children, youth, and their parents. To say it another way, we believe that investing in family ministry will be the one thing that changes everything.

This isn't a new concept for us as a church. In fact, we took a big step in this direction three years ago when we reconfigured our staffing in order to hire a full time Director of Children's Ministry (Claire) and a full time Director of Youth Ministry (Josh - *now Minister to Youth and Young Adults*). This has been one of the best decisions we have made as a congregation! Claire and Josh consistently provide outstanding leadership and direction to our children and youth ministries. But let me wave the caution flag... If we think that all we need to do to develop an amazing family ministry program is to hire a few people and set them loose, we will fall short. Because investing in family ministry requires more than staffing.

Our investment in family ministry means that we will need to create safe, welcoming, and updated environments for children, youth, and their parents. Yes, this includes updates to our facilities and security procedures, but the environment is also shaped by the people in it. A welcoming volunteer, with a smile on their face and a love for children, does more to shape the environment than paint or furniture. A solid family ministry program is going to need the efforts of many - the young and the seasoned.

Likewise, we will need to focus and maximize our family ministry endeavors. No family today complains about having too much free time. Most of our kids and parents are stretched thin. That means we need to maximize the precious time families give to the church. We've got to be strategic in our faith formation opportunities with our children and youth so that they are equipped to live out that faith on their own. And we've got to resource parents so that they can capably and excellently fulfill their God-given responsibilities with their children. In other words, family ministry isn't just about ages 0-18. It's also about the rest of the family - parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, and other influencers.

There is so much more to say about family ministry, and as this Fall unfolds, you will continue to hear more about how we are following our road map towards a more robust family ministry made possible by church wide investment. But for now, consider this statement:

*Doing more for the family is the best way the church can have consistent influence in the heart of a child.*

Say that to yourself over-and-over. Tape it to your bathroom mirror so that you see it every morning. Write it down on the top of your calendar. Most importantly, add it to your prayer list. Because the further we go on this journey as individuals and as the church, the better off we will be (and our families will be) when God has done God's work in us.




