

God is at Work

I took a moment earlier this week to look back. As we moved fully into the Fall season, I spent some time reviewing all that we had done as a church during the summer. It was almost mind-blowing to think about the ministry that took place inside and outside the church. For example:

- Our children capably led us in worship on Children's Sunday.
- More than 60 of us knocked down pins at the All Church Bowling Night.
- Our Off-Site VBS at the Wichita Falls Housing Authority



brought kids and families together for a week of fun.

- We hosted our first Father-Daughter Dance on the weekend of Father's Day.
- We sent our children and youth to four different summer camps at Disciples Crossing as well as kids and grandparents to Grand Camp.
- Our College Ministry met for Bible Study every week and threw in a couple of fun trips.
- Our church generously collected diapers for the Youth Mission Trip.
- The Christian Men's Fellowship continued their monthly breakfasts, and had to add tables to accommodate more participants.
- More than 150 kids and 40 volunteers participated in our Vacation Bible School, and more than 350 kids and family members joined in the VBS Family Night.



 Eighty participants from the church

loaded up on a bus (and in cars) and traveled to Arlington for our ${\bf Family\ Afternoon\ with\ the\ Rangers}.$

- Fifteen youth and adults spent a week working around Austin on our **Youth Mission Trip**.
- Members of our church filled baskets for newly arriving International (Global Education) students at MSU. These baskets included bedding, towels, kitchen supplies, and more.
- We gathered as a church for three weeks during the August Adult Forum, where we talked about why people need Jesus Christ, the Church, and this church.
- Our kids joined with kids from First Presbyterian

- Church and First United Methodist Church in a **Children's Day of Service**, making cookies, serving at the Food Bank, and doing other mission work.
- Nearly every Sunday afternoon, youth, college students, and adults gathered for fun and fellowship as they played Pickleball in our gym.
- Our youth had a blast on one of the hottest days of the year for their Youth Trip to Six Flags.
- 27 youth and adults traveled to Carrollton for a Youth Lock-In at Group Dynamix.
- More than 60 folks joined an At the Table Group and have met in groups of 6-8 in restaurants and homes.
- Our Outreach Ministry helped host a Back to School Bash for new students at Fain Elementary.



- The Feed My Flock ministry met and prepared meals for those in our church who need a home-cooked meal.
- Our children, youth, and Young Family tried to escape the heat through multiple Pool Parties held throughout the summer.
- The Discovery Class hosted more than 65 riders in town for the Hotter 'n' Hell race.
- Our Children Come First program had more than 85 kids enrolled over the summer and began the Fall season with nearly 80 kids and a waiting list exceeding 70.
- Our Young Ages Preschool kicked off their 51st year with 39 students.
- We asked our FCC church family to consider serving as a Fain Elementary Prayer Partner. In 72 hours, every teacher, administrator, and staff member at Fain had someone from our church signed up to pray for them this year.

And we could add to this list all sorts of ongoing ministries - our Sunday worship services, The Neighborhood, the Chancel Choir, Sunday School classes, Common Ground Recovery Ministries, our Elders, and others - faithfully continued to meet and shepherd every person to encounter the abundant peace of Christ.

The first reason to look back is to give thanks. We can give thanks for the many ways we saw God show up in the lives of our congregation this summer. Throughout all of those ministry opportunities listed above, we saw God's faithfulness abound.

But another reason to look back is to identify areas where we need to "add fuel to the fire" - to further support growing ministries and prepare for new seasons of engagement. And, we've got more than a few of these! God has been at work in our congregation, and so we will continue to do our part to prepare for what God is doing in our midst. That will include our ministry planning this Fall, the presentation of an architectural master plan, budget planning for 2024, and more.

I am amazed at all that has taken place through First Christian Church. And I'm excited for what lies in front of us this Fall as we help others engage with Jesus Christ.
